Sec. 1. Department of Environmental Protection to review environmental permitting laws and work with working group.

Resolved: That the Department of Environmental Protection shall consider whether on-water aquaculture should be subject to the same or similar regulatory regime as land-based aquaculture. The legislature shall administer a working group to work with the DEP and that working group shall submit a report of its review, no later than October 1, 2024, including any suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources.

Sec 2. Composition of the working group

1. Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;

2. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;

3. Five members appointed by the President of the Senate as follows:

A. Two members representing a nonprofit organization with interest and experience in aquaculture.

- B. One member representing the State of Maine Harbor Masters Association;
- C. One member representing the lobster industry
- D. One member representing an aquaculture trade association or industry group;
- E. One member representing the citizens of Maine

4. Five members appointed by the Speaker of the House as follows:

A. Two members representing the wild marine harvest.

B. One member who is small aquaculture lease holder defined as less than a cumulative amount of 50 acres.

C. One member who is a former commissioner or legislator with working knowledge of the waterfront, aquaculture and the lobstering industry.

- D. One member representing the University of Maine System;
- E. One member representing the citizens of Maine

5. Three members appointed by the Governor as follows:

- A. One member representing the Department of Marine Resources;
- B. One member representing the Department of Environmental Protection; and
- C. One member representing the Department of Economic and Community Development.
